Benefits as a patron



With your **patronage fee**, you support the mountain rescue service in training mountain rescuers. They make it possible to perform preventive measures and rescues. Our equipment and training must be paid for, and therefore our work in Alpine terrain cannot be free of charge – even though the more than 12,500 mountain rescuers in Austria are volunteers. The hours we work after mountain accidents in recreational activities must be settled. You can help us do so as a patron.

The membership fee includes:

Annual report

As a patron, you will receive an annual report every year, informing you about the local offices' work in the last year and about mountain rescuer training. The annual report also contains important information on safe behavior in alpine terrain.

Exchanging information within the mountain rescue service

As a patron, you can make use of the entire know-how of the mountain rescue service at all times. Active members will advise and support you. You can participate in subject discussions on alpine safety.

Benefits for mountain rescue events

As a patron, you will receive various benefits for events hosted by the mountain rescue service (entry fees, admission fees, etc.).

Rescue cost coverage

At a patronage of at least 28.00 Euro* per year, the mountain rescue service insurance will cover your rescue costs (mountain and water rescue) in emergency anywhere in the world up to an amount of 25,000.00 Euro. Insurance protection starts one day after payment and covers your family or life partner with a shared household and children younger than 18.

Searches and tragedies are avoidable

Things happen faster than you would think in the mountains. Please tell your relatives, acquaint-ances or hosts where you are going and when you are planning to return before leaving on any tour. Always take the recommended equipment – depending on season: Cell phone, wind- and weather-proof clothes, bivouac sack, headlight, whistle, food and drink or an LVS-unit, one rod sensor and one avalanche shovel per person on skiing, snowboard or snow shoe tours. Practice! Take classes. Please read up on the subject! Risk-management is important for recreational athletes, too.

* This fee includes the insurance premium that will be passed on to the insurance unreduced. The remaining amount is the membership fee.

In case of a claim send your mountain rescue invoice and a copy of your payment slip to confirm the transfer – including a brief accident report. Mail them to our state organization in the state in which you are registered as a patron.
